




Big Advice:

- Don't rush to be huge and jump to LeSS Huge (bigger !<> better)
- In fact, start small (e.g. with LeSS, with <8 teams, if you can)</p>
- Run LeSS Product Development adoption, as an <u>experiment</u>
- Set up initial LeSS adoption, as a *parallel organization*
- Treat Organizational Design as the factor of primary significance
- Have a lot of patience and get ready to have a lot of fun

IMPORTANT!

Requirement areas are scaled-up feature teams. Scaling up by structuring teams according to the product's architecture is called development areas. The table below summarizes the differences.




Try collapsing tiny (fake) RAs, by expanding your product definition (from a user's / customer's perspective)






